

## **CCOA CALL FOR LOCAL CONSULTANTS**

The Coalition to Counter Online Antisemitism (CCOA) is looking for five consultants to support the work on the coalition's policy roadmap focused on combatting online antisemitism.

The CCOA is a pan-European network bringing together a broad range of stakeholders from different geographies to fight online antisemitism, create innovative ideas beyond sectors and foster a new set of partnerships to amplify best practices. As part of these aims, CCOA is building a **pan-European policy roadmap on online antisemitism** to be delivered to the European Commission at the end of 2024. The roadmap will lay out the contemporary policy landscape, challenges and solutions for combatting antisemitism on social media, from the perspective of platforms, governments and regulators.

In order to root the policy roadmap in local experience and expertise, the aim of the consultants' work will be to gather and condense local perspectives relevant to the issue area. These findings will be used by the CCOA policy team to inform their drafting of the policy roadmap.

The CCOA is seeking to hire a total of five consultants, one in each of its member countries: Germany, Italy, France, Sweden, and Poland. Applications from both organizations and individual consultants will be accepted.

### **Responsibilities and scope of work**

- Stakeholder mapping of local communities and experts relevant to antisemitism on social media, with input from the existing CCOA network.
- Consultation with stakeholders on online antisemitism and policy responses.
- Feedback of consultation findings to CCOA team.

### **Expected deliverables:**

1. Consultation with 7-10 relevant organisations and individuals, including through bilateral meetings and at least one (digital or in-person) multi-stakeholder roundtable.
2. Submission of findings to the CCOA team and attendance at internal roundtables to discuss findings.
3. Peer review of final policy roadmap.
4. Stakeholder engagement on the final policy roadmap, at both local and EU level.
5. Attendance of the CCOA Conference in November.

### **Competencies and experience**

- Strong relationships with local stakeholders in the areas of antisemitism and digital policy.
- High level of subject matter expertise on antisemitism and digital policy.

- Written and verbal fluency in English and relevant local languages.

### **Timeline**

Consultants are expected to complete the scope of work, which is estimated to take approx. 15 days total, but may take more time.

The consultancy period will run from August to November 2024, with delivery of findings to the CCOA team scheduled mid-October. Ad hoc work reviewing the policy roadmap and feeding back into stakeholder communities will continue until the end of the year.

The contract signing with the consultant is anticipated to occur in August 2024.

### **Location**

The role will be fully remote. Consultants will be expected to hold stakeholder meetings in-person where possible. Regular meetings with the CCOA team will be held online. Consultants will be expected to attend the CCOA Conference in Warsaw scheduled for 25-27 November 2024.

### **Budget**

Each consultant will receive a payment of 3000 euros (in two instalments).

The total budget for is 3000 Euros gross. If reverse tax liability applies, the total net amount will be contracted.

Shortlisted applicants will proceed to the interview, followed by the signing of the contract with them.
