

CCOA CALL FOR EVALUATOR OF EDUCATION TOOLKIT

The Coalition to Counter Online Antisemitism (CCOA) is seeking a consultant to evaluate a toolkit on countering online antisemitism and its impact.

The CCOA is a pan-European network that unites diverse stakeholders from various regions to combat online antisemitism, develop innovative ideas across sectors, and foster new partnerships to enhance best practices. To support these goals, the CCOA is developing a Training Toolkit to counter online antisemitism, which will serve as a resource for the network. This toolkit will outline the current policy landscape, challenges, and solutions for addressing antisemitism on social media.

To ground the development of the training toolkit on countering online antisemitism in Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) guidelines, the consultant's role will be to gather and synthesize the impact of the toolkit through feedback to the development team of experts and monitoring the two piloting phases of the toolkit (1. general piloting phase; 2. training of multipliers piloting). These insights will guide the CCOA policy team, and the external consultant working on the toolkit to adjust and improve it according to impact measurement.

The CCOA aims to hire one consultant from one of the following countries: Germany, Italy, France, Sweden, and Poland or the European Union. Applications from both organizations and freelance consultants are welcome.

Responsibilities and scope of work

- Monitoring and evaluating the development process of the CCOA education training toolkit
- Provide regular feedback to the education expert developing team of the toolkit and the CCOA team via check-ins (check-ins with education consultants and CCOA team)
- Participation in both piloting test round
- Written feedback of training material (3 feedback rounds)
- Showcase impact stories

Expected deliverables:

- Create a mid-term evaluation report (one after each piloting phase) and a final evaluation report after the finalisation of the product.

Competencies and experience

- High level of subject matter expertise on M&E and preferably education on antisemitism

- Strong experience working with community organisations and in an international setting
- Written and verbal fluency in English and relevant local languages.

Timeline

Consultants are expected to complete the scope of work, which is estimated to take approx. 25 days total, but may take more time.

The consultancy period will run from August to December 2024, with delivery of findings to the CCOA team scheduled at end of November. Feedback circles will continue until the end of the year.

The contract signing with the consultant is anticipated to occur in August 2024.

Location

The role will be fully remote. Consultants will be expected to hold stakeholder meetings in-person where possible. Regular meetings with the CCOA team will be held online. Consultants will be expected to attend the CCOA Conference in Warsaw scheduled for 25-27 November 2024.

Budget

The consultant will receive a payment of 12.500 Euros (in three instalments).

The total budget for each consultant is 12.500 Euros gross. If reverse tax liability applies, the total net amount will be contracted.

Application process

Shortlisted applicants will proceed to the interview, followed by the signing of the contract with them.
